Travel north on Route 301 for about 2.3 miles to the Melford/Belair Drive exit. At the bottom of the ramp, turn left onto Belair Drive. Travel about .8 mile on Belair Drive to Kenway Lane. (Grace Lutheran Church is on the right.) Turn left onto Kenway Lane, and go about a block. Make the first left onto Kinder Place. Kinder Place is a cul-de-sac. Louise's home is a rancher with light yellow siding and colonial blue shutters.

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE FOR HURRICANES AND WILD FIRES: We have seen the dramatic images of the devastation hurricanes and wildfires have caused recently. It is easy to feel overwhelmed by the scope of the destruction and to feel helpless to do something of substance for the people affected by these historic weather events. There is something each of us can do right now that is physical, tangible help. Lutheran Disaster Response of the ELCA is ready and able to assist and you can contribute financially to the effort. If you choose to contribute, the best way is to write a check to “All Saints Lutheran Church” and put “L.D.R. – Hurricanes” or L.D. R - Wildfires on the memo line. Then put it in the offering plate this Sunday or mail it or bring it to the church office. You may also contribute electronically by EFT or credit card. Then one check will be sent from All Saints Church to Lutheran Disaster Response. So far, **\$8,478** has been donated from All Saints members to help with these relief efforts. **Congregation to Award
Mission Endowment Grants in 2018**

Thanks to a large legacy gift to All Saints Lutheran Church by Rev. Wanda McNeill, the Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) Committee will begin accepting applications for grants in early 2018. Rev. McNeill served with All Saints Church as a seminary Intern and a Pastoral Assistant September 1985 – May 1988. She is fondly remembered for her leadership, care, and steady guidance during that time.

The MEF Committee has met several times to develop a policy and procedures by which Rev. McNeill's gifts are invested and grants will be received, reviewed, and approved. The Committee has invested the money in three diversified funds and established an endowed scholarship in Rev. McNeill's name with a portion of her gifts. The Committee developed an application form for grant applicants, including individuals, ministry teams, and committees of the congregation. The application form will be available on the congregation website and from the church office. Procedures have been developed to review applications. Applications approved by the MEF Committee will be recommended to the Congregation Council for final award approval.

The application and award procedures are governed by paragraph C5.05 of the congregation constitution. Grants recommended by the MEF Committee for approval must support one of the following three ministry areas:

1. New or enhanced ministries of All Saints Lutheran Church.
2. Outreach ministries in the Metropolitan Washington D.C. area, including Bowie.
3. Mission of the ELCA in the United States and worldwide.

It is important for everyone to understand that grants will be made each year based solely on the amount of income generated by the MEF investments accounts and designated contributions during the previous year. MEF grants will not be used as substitutes for ministry or mission that is supported by the Annual Spending Plan of the congregation.

The MEF Committee will receive applications in July and December of each year. The committee will recommend grant applications to the Congregation Council during the year following that in which the income is produced. However, for 2018 awards, application will be accepted in both December 2017 and January 2018 and the committee will recommend approved applications to the council in early 2018.

Contributions to the Mission Endowment Fund are welcome anytime and there are many ways to contribute. You can prepare a legacy gift with your financial planner. You can also make a contribution of cash, stock, or other financial method. If you or someone you know would like more information about the Mission Endowment Fund and how to contribute, a member of the MEF Committee or Pastor Gary will be happy to talk with you.
